PASTOR'S CORNER - Life's Struggles part A

Sometimes life's troubles can get people down and they think they are falling short in every direction. Frequently OUR response is to send out affirmations and encouragement. Sadly, oftentimes those words only bring temporary relief. They don't heal the deeper wounds of insufficiency and dissatisfaction. Even when we include scripture, those encouragements bring focus on **ourselves** as the solution to our 'internal' problems. What we need to do is find the passages that point them to unshakable truths **in God's Word that lift their eyes upward**.

- 1. God Loves You Unconditionally The truth is, our culture teaches us that our value is based on how well we produce and succeed. Sometimes we fall into the trap of believing that God also loves us based on our performance for Him. But point in fact, God loved us even before we were born; God sets His love on us because of His mercy. We can see in Scriptures such as Ps. 103:13,14 and 1 John 4:16 that God KNOWS our imperfections and loves us anyway. We truly encourage when we remind them that their worth isn't based on performance but on God's perfect love for them.
- **2. God Created You with Limits** When people in Christ come to share their struggles, we are sometimes tempted to offer a "life hack" or try to motivate them to push through. While God calls us to perseverance, sometimes we unintentionally communicate unrealistic expectations about our humanity—that we're meant to do it all, do it on our own, and do it perfectly. Instead, we should point them to God's good design in his creation. Genesis 1–2 displays how God made us embodied, gendered, and dependent human beings. While the world says we're to reject and move past these limits, God tells us we are "very good" (1:31). Often, believers feel inadequate because of their God-given limitations. They feel anxious and exhausted because they're trying to be and do what God never intended for them as finite creatures. Reminding them of God's power made perfect in their weakness (2 Cor. 12:9) frees them to rest in the good boundaries God has put around their body, mind, and soul. Instead of denying or bemoaning limits, we can encourage our friends that their weaknesses deepen their dependence of God's grace.

Next week we will look at two additional ideas regarding our struggles in life.
